

Bill Language

Earmark of \$2,500,000 to operate the United States Department of Justice, National Advocacy Center in South Carolina.

Language directing the Attorney General to provide a magnetometer and not less than one qualified guard at each unsecured entrance to 625 Silver Street, in Albuquerque, New Mexico, for the duration of the time Department of Justice employees occupy this building.

Earmark of \$3,800,000 to Texas Tech University for wind research.

Earmark of \$5,000,000 to fund a cooperative agreement with Montana State University for a research program on green buildings.

Earmark of \$113,500,00 to the National Institute of Standards and Technology's Manufacturing Extension Partnership, for transfer to Regional Centers.

Earmark of \$192,500,000 to the National Institute of Standards and Technology's Advanced Technology. \$82,000,000 of this amount is earmarked for new grants.

Language directing the Administrator of the General Services Administration, in coordination with the Secretary of Commerce to locate suitable office space to operate the Census Monitoring Board in the W. Edwards Deming Building in Suitland, Maryland.

Earmark of \$12,000,000 to the Center for Cultural and Technical Interchange Between East and West in the State of Hawaii, pursuant to the Center for Cultural and Technical Exchange Between East and West Act of 1960.

\$1,500,000 to the North/South Center to provide for carrying out the provisions of the North/South Center Act of 1991.

Language directing \$3,000,000 to Lackawanna County, Pennsylvania for infrastructure development.

\$3,000,000 earmark to the National Technology Transfer Center at Wheeling Jesuit University, West Virginia to continue the out reach program to assist small business development.

\$2,000,000 earmark to Western Carolina University to develop a facility to assist in small business and rural economic development.

\$1,500,000 grant to the State University of New York to develop a facility and operate the Institute of Entrepreneurship for small business and workforce development.

\$1,000,000 as a grant for the Genesis Small Business Incubator Facility in Fayetteville, Arkansas.

Language directing \$500,000 as a continuation grant to the Center for Entrepreneurial Opportunity in Greensburg, Pennsylvania, to provide for small business consulting and assistance.

Language directing the Secretary of Energy to convey without consideration lands at or in the vicinity of Los Alamos National Laboratory, that are suitable for conveyance or transfer.

\$7,000,000 for emergency expenses to provide disaster assistance pursuant to the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act for the Bristol Bay and Kuskokwin areas of Alaska.

Report Language

Language directing the Attorney General to provide \$2,000,000 for the Security Technology Program of the Southwest Surety Institute, administered by the New Mexico State University, the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology, and Arizona State University.

\$2,000,000 earmark to support operations of the State and local training centers for the First Responders at Fort McClellan, Alabama, and an additional \$2,000,000 earmark to operate a similar training center with the Energetic Materials Research and Testing Center at the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology.

\$5,200,000 for bomb technician training at Alabama's Redstone Arsenal, Hazardous Device Center.

\$2,000,000 to support the continuation and expansion of Violent Crime Task Forces in New Hampshire and South Carolina for demonstration projects focused on specific law enforcement problems regarding the impact of spillover violence from high crime areas into smaller neighborhoods.

Earmark of \$48,321,000 to provide 1,864 additional detention bed spaces at INS facilities in Buffalo, New York, and Krome, Florida and a contract facility in San Diego, California.

\$3,125,000 of INS funds, to purchase and install additional card production machines for the Border Crossing Card Replacement Program, including one machine which is to be located in southeastern Kentucky.

\$1,900,000 of INS funds earmarked for the expansion of the Texas Service Center to accommodate the transfer of files and Direct Mail processing of naturalization applications.

An earmark of \$17,699,000 and 277 positions to improve facilitation at air and sea ports of entry, including full-time manning by inspectors of the three in-transit lounges at Miami International Airport. \$3,000,000 earmark for a secure electronic network for travelers rapid inspection (SENTRI), dedicated commuter lanes, including equipment and facilities modifications in Laredo and Hidalgo, Texas and Nogales, Arizona.

\$700,000 earmark for automated permit ports, including equipment and facilities modifications in Bridgewater and Limestone, Maine, Morses Line and Highgate Springs, Vermont Mooers, New York, including enrollment centers; Sweetgrass, Montana; Nighthawk, Washington, and Skagway, Alaska.

Language directing \$2,800,000 to continue the technology commercialization initiative at the National Technology Transfer Center, in Wheeling, West Virginia.

\$1,048,000 earmark to continue the Arson and Explosion Research Program at the University of Central Florida.

\$500,000 earmark for the Alaska Native Justice Center.

\$3,000,000 earmark for the Jefferson Parish, Louisiana sheriff's Department for software development and network capability to enhance radio communications and to develop a model for interconnectivity and interoperability.

\$10,000,000 earmark for the North Carolina Criminal Justice Information System to meet North Carolina's public safety needs.

Earmark of \$800,000 for South Dakota Division of Criminal Investigation to procure equipment for law enforcement, telecommunications, emergency communications, and the state forensic laboratory.

A \$100,000 earmark to establish a 911 emergency system in Roberts County, South Dakota.

A \$2,000,000 earmark to establish a rural states management information system demonstration in Alaska.

An earmark of \$1,000,000 to develop and deploy a multi-agency, multi-jurisdictional communications system in the Northeast to support routine and emergency communications between local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies.

A \$500,000 earmark to the Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina police department for computer enhancements and policing equipment upgrades.

A \$500,000 earmark to Charleston, South Carolina to develop new technologies which will enhance local law enforcement's ability to respond to 911 calls.

\$1,300,000 for the Suffolk University Center for Juvenile Justice, in Boston, MA, dedicated to representing 1.) children in criminal cases in juvenile court; 2.) children and parents in civil matters; 3.) gang related matters, and 4.) abuse cases.

\$300,000 for the Metro Denver Gang Coalition to allow service providers and community members to share information,, support program efforts, and to create positive changes in youth, families, and communities.

\$100,000 earmark for the Crow Creek, South Dakota, Alcohol and Drug Program.

Language advocating enhanced security at a government-leased facility housing federal employees in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

An earmark of \$9,000,000 for the National Textile Center, consortium, to 1.) continue funding its current participants 2.) expand its program to include the Philadelphia College of Textiles, in PA, and 3.) \$3,000,000 of this \$9,000,000 to the Textile Clothing Corporation.

\$3,800,000 to Texas Tech University for research regarding protective studies and other technologies designed to save lives threatened by tornadoes and severe wind storms.

\$5,000,000 to Montana State University for research on building products, processes and technologies which utilize under-used natural resources and environmentally sound technologies.

\$2,900,000 earmark for unanticipated cost associated with completing the Boulder laboratory.

\$15,200,00 earmark for cost associated with completing the Santa Cruz laboratory in California.

\$2,000,000 earmark from the National Estuarine Research Reserve, for the ACE Basin.

\$800,000 earmark for compensation for commercial cranberry losses resulting from environmental contamination near the Massachusetts Military Reservation, in bogs fed by ground water contaminated by ethylene dibromide emanating from the Massachusetts Military Reservation.
